The Eugene Applebaum College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (EACPHS) at Wayne State University (WSU) is seeking candidates for a 12-month, non-tenure track faculty position in ambulatory care. The practice site will be within Henry Ford Health System. The individual will be part of the WSU Department of Pharmacy Practice, which has 35 faculty members and a comprehensive network of outstanding adjunct faculty. The department has affiliations with numerous area health systems and community pharmacy organizations in Southeastern Michigan, an area recognized nationally for progressive pharmacy practice. The department's vision is to advance the practice of pharmacy and improve health outcomes through meaningful and innovative research, teaching and service.

Henry Ford Health System is a vertically integrated health system that includes numerous ambulatory medical centers and an employed medical group. The department of pharmacy services at Henry Ford Hospital will assist the faculty member in establishing new ambulatory clinical pharmacy services in an area with high potential for collaboration (internal medicine, family medicine). This new clinic will expand upon the department's established ambulatory services and the faculty member will join two other co-funded WSU faculty members at Henry Ford Hospital.

Responsibilities: Didactic and experiential education, participation in the expansion of ambulatory care pharmacy services at the practice site, residency education, providing care in an active clinical practice, collaborative clinical research or other scholarly activity, and service to the department, college and community.

Requirements: Successful candidates must possess the doctor of pharmacy degree and have completed post-doctoral residency and/or fellowship training or possess equivalent experience. Desirable qualifications are completion of a PGY-2 specialty pharmacy residency in ambulatory care or a related field. Candidates also must be eligible for licensure in the State of Michigan. Candidates with an established record of teaching and scholarly accomplishments and board certification are highly desirable.
